PROHIBITION OF REDISCLOSURE  
OF INFORMATION CONCERNING CLIENT IN  
ALCOHOL OR DRUG ABUSE TREATMENT

This notice accompanies a disclosure of information concerning a client in alcohol/ drug abuse treatment made to you with the consent of such client. This information has been disclosed to you from records protected by Federal confidentiality rules (42 CFR Part 2). The Federal rules prohibit you from making any further disclosures of this information unless further disclosure is expressly permitted by the written consent of the person to whom it pertains or as otherwise permitted by 42 CFR Part 2. A general authorization for the release of medical or other information is NOT sufficient for this purpose. The Federal rules restrict any use of the information to criminally investigate or prosecute any alcohol or drug abuse patient.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF ADMISSION: This is the first De Paul Outpatient treatment for this twenty nine year old, single, white, employed male. The patient stated that his presenting problems are alcohol and marijuana. Patient stated that the events leading to his admission were that he had been drinking a couple of six-packs, took some pornographic pictures of a thirteen year old, was charged with second degree sexual assault, got out of Work Release Program after spending nine months in jail and needs treatment. Referral person and phone number is MCA; phone number is 276-8487 and also order a judge. Current pressures in life are trying to find an apartment, and financial. He feels he is in bad shape and normally other job stresses.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS: He is currently living with his grandmother at 2357 South 57th Street, West Allis 53219 but the patient stated that this is just temporary until he finds his own apartment. The patient is covered under Metropolitan Insurance.

ALCOHOL AND DRUG HISTORY: The patient stated that his primary drug of choice is alcohol, beer, and hard liquor. The patient stated his last date of usage was in November of 1989. Patient stated that he first began using at age 17 with friends, partying and that he became heavy while in the army in Germany from ages 19 to 21. The patient denies any amounts of usage in the last thirty days. Patient stated that in the past year, his primary drug of choice is alcohol. He was drinking on weekends, six to twelve packs of beer, sometimes hard liquor. The patient denies any physical problems as a result of the use of these chemicals. Emotionally, the patient stated that he has suffered from depression, guilt, shame and remorse. The patient stated that in September of 1988, he considered his alcohol and drug use a problem after his second degree sexual assault incident because he could have not done it had he not been drinking. In the following areas of his life, his alcohol use: Under marital, he denied any problems. Relationship or family: He stated that it has put some stress in the family relationship but the parents are divorced and live in other states. Work: The patient stated that he has missed some work as a result of this incident with his sexual assault charge. Socially: The patient stated that he doesn't have much of a social life. Physically: The patient denies any problems. Legally: The patient stated second degree sexual assault charge in September of 1989 as a result of drinking. The patient stated emotionally, he suffers from guilt, shame, and remorse. Patient denies that he has ever attempted or considered suicide during his alcohol or drug use: The patient stated that he has attempted to deal with his alcohol or drug use in the past by attending AA meetings on his own about four years ago for a few months. Patient stated that he quit going. Patient stated that his longest dry period in the last twelve months has been six months. Patient stated that he saw a

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psychologist a couple of years ago as a result of his being caught for urinating in a park; he had no other history of AODA counseling or therapy.

FAMILY AND MARITAL: Family of origin: The patient's mother's name is Joyce, age 55. The patient stated that she has some health problems; the exact nature is unknown but he denies alcohol and drug abuse problems. The patient's father's name is Lionel, age 54, in good health and denies alcohol and drug abuse problem. The patient stated that he has one brother, David, age twenty three, in good health and denies any alcohol and drug abuse problems. The patient's parents' marital status is divorced. Patient stated that he was raised by both parents. Patient stated he is closest to his grandmother as they get along very well. She is eighty four and he does live with her at this time. Patient denies any positive aspects about his family and states negative aspects, there is a lot of fighting and arguing. Patient denies any religious involvement. Patient stated that his ethnic cultural background is German and English and denies any importance to this. The patient stated that grandfather on mother's side was a heavy drinker.

Current marital status: Not applicable. The patient stated that in his immediate family, anger and conflict is handled in not any real way. The patient denies any previous marriage. Patient denies any current responsibilities from previous relationships. Patient denies any religious involvement of current family situation. Patient denies any cultural influence on current family situation.

SINGLE STATUS: The patient stated that he sees himself single at this time because marriage is too expensive and too risky from what he has already observed. The patient stated that he is comfortable being single. Patient denies any intimate relationship. Patient stated that his friends are about half and half as far as single and in relationship. Patient stated that he spends most of his major holidays alone.

Recreational: The patient stated for support system, he relies on himself. Under activities, he stated he again relies on himself and for closeness, he denies any closeness to anybody for support system.

EDUCATIONAL/VOCATIONAL: The patient stated the last grade he completed was 12th grade at Revere High School in Richfield, Ohio at age 18. Patient stated that he tried college but did not have any interest and that he quit after three months. Other training included three months of college. Patient stated that he was in the Army from 1979 to 1981. His capacity was field medic. His length of time was two and a half years there. He was not involved in combat and his type of discharge was honorable. The patient stated that his military service was significant to him because it put money in his pocket and gave him a chance to travel. The patient's current employer is Ambrosia; length of time there is five years; position, mixer. The patient stated that he dislikes his supervisors. The pay is low and he dislikes the downtown location. The patient stated his alcohol and drug use has not in any way, significantly affected his work and the patient stated that he considered something in the Medical field but did not follow through on this. Future work plans: The patient stated he

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has no real plans or goals under short-term and long-term. The patient denies that his employer played a role in his treatment. Patient states that his job is secure. Patient stated that he prefers if we do not contact his employer. Patient stated that under other jobs held, he has been a phlebotomist at the Milwaukee Blood Plasma Center for about one and a half years, and that he worked in a restaurant in Florida.

SOCIAL/RECREATIONAL: The patient stated that he goes to the movies, goes out to dinner to the Domes and watches T.V. The patient stated that he is involved in these activities whenever he gets a chance but that he usually works six days a week. Patient denies exercising to keep in shape. Patient stated that he used to work out at Vic Tanny in the past but that he stopped going because of work and the incident with the sexual assault charge. Patient stated that he had not recently had a chance to give himself any private time due to working and if he does find private time, he does not have difficulty finding things to do. Patient described his friendships as working relationships and acquaintances and that he does not have any real close friends.

LEGAL: The patient stated that he is on probation. The name of his probation agent is Donna Chester; her address is 1673 South 9th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin; phone number is 649-2873. The patient stated that he is not in any current legal trouble or have any current legal proceedings except that he has to report to his P.O. every two weeks. The patient stated that up to this point regarding his legal situation, he has done his time in the Work Release Program for nine months. Patient stated that "yes, his alcohol and drug use has been involved in his legal problems, because his assault would not have occurred had he not been drinking." The patient is expecting De Paul to be helpful in his legal actions as the courts and MCA ordered him to report to Outpatient for treatment.

OTHER: Asked if there were any other important issues we haven't covered which the patient felt would be important to discuss and he stated "just as far as his money and financial situation is concerned." The patient stated that he does not have any other concerns or questions regarding De Paul, his treatment or his assessment.

THERAPIST'S ASSESSMENT: The patient was cooperative and open in answering questions. Patient appeared withdrawn and depressed. He stated that his financial problems at this time are really bothering him and that one of his main goals for right now is to get an apartment of his own. The patient seemed appropriate for the Pace Program as this therapist identified the presenting problem of alcohol abuse, continuous.
